The Theme: Winter Wonderland

Winter in Ireland is magical – serene landscapes, majestic castles, cozy fires, Northern Lights and much, much more.

The winter solstice, which falls each December around the 21st or the 22nd, is the shortest day of the year and marks an ancient celebration. The shortest day and longest night, the winter solstice was a key date in the pagan calendar across Ireland for centuries.

Christmas Day is one of the most popular winter holidays in Ireland, as is St Stephen's Day (or the Day of the Wren) on the 26th of December. There are many legends as to the origins of the Day of the Wren, or "Lá an Dreoilín" in Irish, but it generally focus on a story in which the life of Jesus is likened to that of a little bird. On the Day of the Wren, groups would go from door to door in their neighborhood wearing old clothes and straw hats and playing music and dancing. They are called Wren-boys, think a type of Mummers.

Snowy Irish landscapes, winter wildlife, Northern lights, winter solstice, Wren Boys, and holiday spirit are just some topics you could use for subject matter. Your interpretation of the theme is endless.
